The said defendant is accused as follows:

COUNT: I

The said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, did in the City and County of San Francisco, State of California, on or about the 27th day of July, 2015, commit the crime of SECOND DEGREE ROBBERY, to wit: Violating Section 211 of the Penal Code, a Felony, in that the said defendant did unlawfully, and by means of force and fear take personal property, to wit: U.S. CURRENCY, from the person, possession, and immediate presence of JOANNA GARCIA; said robbery being in the Second Degree.

The above offense is a serious felony within the meaning of Penal Code section 1192.7(c) and a violent felony within the meaning of Penal Code section 667.5(c).

ALLEGATION OF ATTEMPT OR USE OF A DEADLY WEAPON PURSUANT TO PENAL CODE SECTION 1203(e)(2)

It is further alleged that the said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, is ineligible for probation, within the meaning of Penal Code Section 1203(e)(2).

COUNT: II

The said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, did in the City and County of San Francisco, State of California, on or about the 27th day of July, 2015, commit the crime of SECOND DEGREE ROBBERY, to wit: Violating Section **211** of the Penal Code, a Felony, in that the said defendant did unlawfully, and by means of force and fear take personal property, to wit: U.S. CURRENCY, from the person, possession, and immediate presence of KEYLIN ROSALES; said robbery being in the Second Degree.

The above offense is a serious felony within the meaning of Penal Code section 1192.7(c) and a violent felony within the meaning of Penal Code section 667.5(c).

COUNT: III

The said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, did in the City and County of San Francisco, State of California, on or about the 27th day of July, 2015, commit the crime of POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, to wit: Violating Section 11377(a) of the Health and Safety Code, a Misdemeanor, in that the said defendant did willfully and unlawfully possess a controlled substance, to wit: METHAMPHETAMINE.

ALLEGATION OF COMMISSION OF OFFENSE WHILE ON PAROLE PURSUANT TO PENAL CODE SECTION 1203.085(a)

It is further alleged that the said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, committed a violent or serious felony while he was on state prison parole pursuant to Penal Code Section 3000, within the meaning of Penal Code Section 1203.085(b).

The said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, previously convicted of the crime of SECOND DEGREE ROBBERY, violating section 211 of the Penal Code, a Felony, on or about the 29th day of March, 2010, in the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco, and having thereafter served a term of imprisonment therefor.

ALLEGATION OF PRIOR CONVICTIONS PURSUANT TO PENAL CODE SECTIONS 667(d), 667(e), 1170.12(b), AND 1170.12(c)

It is further alleged that said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, prior to the commission of the above offense, did suffer a conviction and juvenile adjudication within the meaning of Penal Code Sections 667(d), 667(e), 1170.12(b), and 1170.12(c).

ALLEGATION OF INELIGIBILITY FOR PROBATION PURSUANT TO PENAL CODE SECTION 1203.08

It is further alleged that said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, was previously convicted of two or more felonies within a ten-year period exclusive of any and all time in which the defendant was confined in state and federal prison under charges separately brought and tried, within the meaning of Penal Code section 1203.08.

- 1. The said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, previously convicted of the crime of ATTEMPTED CARJACKING, violating section 664/215(a) of the Penal Code, a Felony, on or about the 28th day of September, 2005, in the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco.
- 2. The said defendant, TROY MCALLISTER, previously convicted of the crime of SECOND DEGREE ROBBERY, violating section 211 of the Penal Code, a Felony, on or about the 29th day of March, 2010, in the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco.
